2. Players must be under 11 on 1st September 2009.

4. Up to two fielding substitutes, who can neither bat nor bowl are allowed per team
5. A match consists of 20 overs per side. Each pair of batters will bat for 4 overs.

2. Fixtures must be completed before the next designated Cup weekend.

UNDER-15 A LEAGUE (A.B. Robertson Cup)

Regulations

1. Clubs are advised to make themselves familiar with the contents of the Youth Safety Regulations. (see under Regulations – Youth Safety).
2. Players must be under 15 on 1st September 2009.
3. The wicket shall measure 22 yards in length and an artificial wicket can be used. The home team using an artificial wicket should advise visitors about conditions e.g. no spikes allowed.
4. Matches will be of 70 overs duration.
5. The innings of the side batting first may not exceed 35 overs.
6. The winning team will be the side with the highest score (or where the number of overs in each innings is unequal, the higher run rate per over shall be the winner).
7. If the scores are equal at the end of a match then the side which loses fewer wickets, when the available overs have been bowled, will be declared the winner.
8. If the number of wickets lost by each team is equal and if both teams score an equal number of runs (or an equal number of runs per over where number of overs bowled in each innings is unequal) the match is a tie.
9. In the event of an uncompleted match where the side batting second has not had the opportunity to complete the number of overs to which it is entitled and has neither passed their opponents score nor been bowled out, then, subject to the minimum number of overs as set out in Regulation 10(c), the winner shall be the team that has scored the higher number of runs per over (the number of overs calculated as set out in these regulations).

10. Interrupted Matches

- (a) First innings:

The number of overs available to each side will be reduced by one for each seven minutes of playing time lost.

The run rate will be calculated as the number of runs scored divided by the number of available overs. For example, if the number of overs is reduced from 35 to 25,

because of rain, the number of available overs is 25, even if the side is bowled out in fewer overs.

(b) Second Innings

From the end of the first innings, a further deduction of one over shall be made for each three and a half minutes of playing time lost. The target score will be the run rate for the first innings multiplied by the number of available overs for the second innings (ignore fractions), plus one run. The match is at an end when the side batting second reaches the target score.

Example: Because of rain, only 25 overs are available to side A, which is bowled out for 120 runs in 25 overs. The run rate is $120/25 = 4.8$ runs per over. Again because of rain, side B's innings is limited to 18 overs. The target score i.e. therefore $4.8 \times 18 = 86.4$. When rounded this becomes a target score of 87 (i.e. $86 + 1$).

(c) Minimum Overs

Note that the number of overs may not be reduced below 17. If 17 overs are not bowled in the second innings and a result is not otherwise obtained, the match will be recorded as a 'no result' and the match can be refixed. In the event of 17 overs not being bowled due to interruptions by 4.00 p.m. the first innings shall end on the completion of 17 overs.

11. The maximum overs per spell for fast bowlers is 5 (see Safety Regulation 1) and their maximum overs per day is 9. A limit of 9 overs maximum per bowler applies in respect of all bowlers (fast or slow).
In the event that a match, before it has actually commenced, is reduced to one of less than 35 overs per side, then the maximum number of overs that a bowler may bowl shall likewise be reduced as follows:

Match reduced to between 30 and 34 overs – maximum 8.

Match reduced to between 26 and 29 overs – maximum 7.
Match reduced to between 22 and 25 overs – maximum 6.
Match reduced to between 17 and 21 overs – maximum 5.

12. A standard sized cricket ball shall be used for games.

13. No fielder can field closer than 8 yards from the batsman except the wicketkeeper or any other fielder behind square on the offside.

14. A batter must retire when he has exceeded 74 runs and may not return.

15. Matches to commence at 1.00 p.m. Availability of the ground beyond 6.00 p.m. to be determined at the start of the match.

19. If less than 50% of the available overs have been bowled and the game is abandoned due to weather, the match may be refixed.

2. Players must be under 15 on 1st September 2009.
3. The wicket shall measure 22 yards in length and an artificial wicket can be used. The home team using an artificial wicket should advise visitors about conditions e.g. no spikes allowed.
4. Matches will be of 60 overs duration.
5. The innings of the side batting first may not exceed 30 overs.
6. The winning team will be the side with the highest score (or where the number of overs in each innings is unequal, the higher run rate per over shall be the winner).
7. If the scores are equal at the end of a match then the side which loses fewer wickets, when the available overs have been bowled, will be declared the winner.
8. If the number of wickets lost by each team is equal and if both teams score an equal number of runs (or an equal number of runs per over where number of overs bowled in each innings is unequal) the match is a tie.
9. In the event of an uncompleted match where the side batting second has not had the opportunity to complete the number of overs to which it is entitled and has neither passed their opponents score nor been bowled out, then, subject to the minimum number of overs as set out in Regulation 10(c), the winner shall be the team that has scored the higher number of runs per over (the number of overs calculated as set out in these regulations).

10. Interrupted Matches

(a) First innings:

because of rain, the number of available overs is 20, even if the side is bowled out in fewer overs.

(b) Second Innings

From the end of the first innings, a further deduction of one over shall be made for each three and a half minutes of playing time lost. The target score will be the run rate for the first innings multiplied by the number of available overs for the second innings (ignore fractions), plus one run. The match is at an end when the side batting second reaches the target score.

Example: Because of rain, only 20 overs are available to side A, which is bowled out for 110 runs in 18 overs. The run rate is $110/20 = 5.5$ runs per over. Again because of rain, side B's innings is limited to 15 overs. The target score i.e. therefore $5.5 \times 15 = 82.5$. When rounded this becomes a target score of 83 (i.e. $82 + 1$).

(d) Minimum Overs

Note that the number of overs may not be reduced below 15. If 15 overs are not bowled in the second innings and a result is not otherwise obtained, the match will be recorded as a 'no result' and the match can be refixed. In the event of 15 overs not being bowled due to interruptions by 4.00 p.m. the first innings shall end on the completion of 15 overs.

14. The maximum overs per spell for fast bowlers is 5. A limit of 8 overs maximum per bowler applies in respect of all bowlers (fast or slow).
In the event that a match, before it has actually commenced, is reduced to one of less than 30 overs per side, then the maximum number of overs that a bowler may bowl shall likewise be reduced as follows:

Match reduced to between 25 and 29 overs – maximum 7.
Match reduced to between 21 and 24 overs – maximum 6.

Match reduced to between 17 and 20 overs – maximum 5.
Match reduced to between 15 and 16 overs – maximum 4.

17. A standard sized cricket ball shall be used for games.
18. No fielder can field closer than 8 yards from the batsman except the wicketkeeper or any other fielder behind square on the offside.
19. A batter must retire when he has exceeded 74 runs and may not return.
20. Matches to commence at 1.00 p.m. Availability of the ground beyond 6.00 p.m. to be determined at the start of the match.

21. Points

22. Win 20 points Tie 10 points not refixed for rain 5 points
23. The winner of the Under 15 B League will be the side with the greatest number of points.
24. If less than 50% of the available overs have been bowled and the game is abandoned due to weather, the match may be refixed.

Regulations

1. Innings will consist of a maximum of 20 overs.
2. Each innings can last for a maximum of one hour and twenty minutes.
3. In the first innings, if 20 overs have not been bowled in the time allotted, the innings terminates at the end of the over in progress at that time.

4. The second innings will be confined to the number of overs bowled at the 80 minute point in the first innings.
5. The second innings will end after the over being bowled at the eightieth minute.
6. No bowler may bowl more than 4 overs.
7. The team scoring the most runs will be the winner.
8. If the scores are level at the end of a match the team which loses fewer wickets will be the winner. If wickets lost are equal in this case, the winner will be the team with the higher score after 10 overs or, if still equal, after 9 overs and so on until a winner is determined.
9. Where a match cannot be completed on the same day it must be refixed on that day for a date inside the time frame for section matches. Otherwise it must be decided by a bowlout involving all 11 players on each side.
10. A no-ball called for a foot fault shall be followed by a “free hit”, i.e. a ball off which the batsman cannot be out in the same way as if such ball itself was a No-ball. The free ball shall count as a delivery in the same over.
11. No-balls and wides will each attract a penalty of 2 runs, as well as any additional runs scored.
12. Points: Win 4
13. Section matches to be played by Friday 19th June.
14. Section winners qualify for semi finals and final to be played on Friday 25th June.
15. Section winners where teams finish with the same number of points to be decided by net run rate (“NRR”). NRR is the total number of runs scored by a side in its section divided by the total number of overs it has faced in scoring those runs less the total number of runs conceded in its section divided by the number of overs it has bowled in conceding those runs.

2. The retirement rule does not apply in this competition.
3. The winning team will be the side with the highest score. In the event of a tie the following will apply.
 - (a) The side taking the greatest number of wickets will be the winner.
 - (b) If both sides are all out, the side with the highest overall scoring rate will be the winner.
 - (c) If the result cannot be decided by either of the first two methods, the winner will be the side with the higher scoring rate over the first 20 overs, or if still even, over the first 10 overs.

2. Players must be under 17 on 1st September 2009.
3. The wicket shall measure 22 yards in length and an artificial wicket can be used. The home team using an artificial wicket should advise visitors about conditions e.g. no spikes allowed.
4. Matches will be of 70 overs duration.
5. The innings of the side batting first may not exceed 35 overs.
6. The winning team will be the side with the highest score (or where the number of overs in each innings is unequal, the higher run rate per over shall be the winner).
7. If the scores are equal at the end of a match then the side which loses fewer wickets, when the available overs have been bowled, will be declared the winner. If the number of wickets lost by each team is equal and if both teams score an equal number of runs (or an equal number of runs per over where number of overs bowled in each innings is unequal) the match is a tie.
8.
